

The Inter-Club Print Championship is a great event. It has been held at Deeside College in Connah's Quay for a number of years and the area is well worth visiting. Chester is very close, there are lots of places to visit and stay and many people make a weekend of it every year. In the Championship the best print clubs in

Britain do battle with a fantastic display of quality images – many of them quite different in style and content from those you may have seen at the PDI Championship at Warwick. 12 prints are entered in the first round and 15 in the Final. This year we will have more clubs than ever before with the eight Finalists from 2009 joining two clubs nominated from every Federation.

Although time does not permit a display of more than a few prints we project the images on to a huge screen for the benefit of the audience. The quality of this projection has improved dramatically in recent years with new equipment and technology.

In 2010 there is another attraction to the weekend. You can attend the PAGB Print Championship on Saturday and then, on the Sunday, the opening of the RPS Projected Image Members' Exhibition at the Craig y Don Community Centre in Llandudno.

TAXING ISSUE FOR CLUBS

I have been asked by a photographic club to advise on the following issue.

"Our club has for some years run a very successful series of annual events at a theatre. These evenings have featured prominent photographers and tickets have been available for purchase by the general public. Each has made a surplus after all costs have been met and this has been used to purchase computers and computer programmes, projectors, screens and other technical equipment for club use. Residue has been deposited in a reserve account and drawn on for similar purposes. Apart from raffle proceeds, which have been donated to charity, all surpluses from the events have been used for the benefit of club members. We have no paid officials and pay no honorarium to any club member. We do, of course, meet the fees and expenses of visiting speakers and judges in the normal way but these and other running costs are met from membership and entrance fees. The club has now been told that the surpluses made on these events may be liable to Corporation Tax. This has not been considered previously." "Is this correct?"

After seeking advice, I replied as follows.

It really hangs on the question of whether this is a trading or fund raising activity in the eyes of HM Revenue and Customs. I would agree that the activity is akin to inviting members to one's own club except that it is held at a theatre whose business/activity is performance art. In this case it would then depend on the contract/agreement that the photographic club has with the theatre. I.E. do they just rent the theatre for one night or does the theatre donate/gift the net proceeds to the club etc. This could have an effect on the tax status.

Organisations like the RPS etc. create a separate trading arm with powers to gift any surpluses to the non-profit making part of the organisation so as to avoid paying CT.

The other significant test I know of is - "Is it a fund raising event?". Since there is no specific statement on either club or theatre web site that this "is in aid of club funds" the Revenue would almost certainly deem it to be a trading activity and therefore taxable. I would suggest the club seek professional guidance to clarify/organise the taxable status of their specific event as their circumstances may be different from other clubs running similar events.

If any reader has relevant experience of this or a similar situation, I should be very grateful if you would email details to me. If your club does undertake such an event, it would be wise to seek advice. I will publish what I find in due course.


