London - 6 April 2011

Don Langford APGB CPAGB LRPS (NWPA) completed his two years as President and handed over the reins to our newly elected President

Peter thanked Don for a job very well done and presented him with his Past President Medal.

Annual Report and Accounts

These reported a particularly good year in which a 2009 deficit had been converted to a £13,000 surplus for 2010 and these reports were accepted by the meeting.

Subscription.

The Hon.Treasurer acknowledged the surplus accrued in 2010 but counselled caution in view of the current economic uncertainties. On his recommendation, the membership subscription was set at an unchanged £29 per club to which will be added the cost of the Trustee Liability Insurance of approximately £5.75.

Insurance.

It was agreed that the complete policies for the Public Liability and Trustee Liability Insurance would be posted on the PAGB Website as soon as practicable.

Awards for Photographic Merit.

It was agreed, after a spirited discussion, that Federations will adopt a common APM Pre-Qualification Standard which requires the Applicant to be a current, active member of a Club affiliated to the "sponsoring" Federation. Applications can only be submitted via your Federation Awards Officer. The meeting accepted that a candidate who is active in Federation Events, including Competitions and Awards Workshops, is likely have a much clearer idea of the standard required and will be much better prepared to submit to the APM Adjudication. Those considering an application are therefore highly recommended to attend and participate in as many Federation Competitions and Workshops as they can.

Federation Reports

After the meeting was formally closed Federations were invited as is customary to report on their Federation activities and this proved to be a valuable and informative exercise with many good ideas.

INFORMATION FOR PROSPECTIVE APPLICANTS FOR FIAP AWARDS

It is appreciated that members will achieve the required targets to apply for awards at varying times of the year. It is therefore not surprising that we receive enquires on a regular basis from those members who are eager to apply for such awards. However it is the practice of FIAP to only allow ONE batch of applications to be submitted to them in any one calendar year. In 2011 FIAP made an exception and has allowed two batches, but it is not intended that this will be repeated in 2012.

Whilst FIAP does maintain the application dossier forms on its web site, two things should be kept in mind; firstly FIAP have a track record of making unexpected changes to the procedure at short notice and secondly, our experience is that without substantial guidelines barely 15% of applicants complete those forms correctly. In the light of recent experience and changes that FIAP have requested we are preparing fresh and more detailed guidelines that should be available later in the summer.


Therefore to try and help prospective applicants and to ensure that the process is manageable the following is being implemented.

Some time in August we will publish a general document in PAGB 'e-news' and on the PAGB website, setting out what members need to do to start off their application process. We would ask that you wait until this document is published before making enquiries about the process. There will be plenty of time to get your application together as the deadline for completed applications to reach the FIAP Liaison Officer has been set at 31st March 2012.

Within the next 4 to 6 weeks, hopefully, we will produce a guideline document to those who are setting out on entering International Salons on what they can do to prepare themselves for any future application processes involving FIAP Awards. This will not set out how to take pictures in any way, more to try and help people to avoid some of the pitfalls that have been experienced in the past in making their applications.
