




Aurora over Hamnoy by David Keep - from the Rolls Royce GB Cup winning entry

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

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


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## Masters of Print Hall of Fame

# **CANON UK EVENT**

25 club members from Kent County Federation and 25 from Surrey Photographic Association were treated to a practical day of workshops, held at the Head Offices of Canon UK on 08 November 2017.

The day was organised by Phil Wickenden, on behalf of Canon's marketing department, and Professional Imaging Specialist, Frankie Jim, who, together, devised a packed itinerary for the attendees, offering Natural-looking Portraiture and Creative Still Life workshops, run by Professional Photographers Raj Khephar and Thea Baddiley. Special offers on Canon equipment, books and merchandise were also available throughout the day.

Coffee and Christmas cookies were on offer following registration, which was seamless, thanks to the profusion of Canon staff on hand to guide and advise attendees at all points of the day.

Following an introduction and run-through of the day's timetable from Medea, one of Canon's more experienced representatives, the attendees were split into two groups with wristbands to ensure that the 'Green Group' and the 'Pink Group' could easily be identified. The groups were then guided to Canon's spacious 'breakout area' which had been split into two sections. A cornucopia of Canon equipment was available for the camera club members to borrow, from the Canon IDX Mark 2 down to the new mirrorless Canon M5.

The Green Group was given a short introductory talk by Raj, explaining how the Portraiture workshop would work and reasons for the lighting set-ups, including the use of coloured gels, as well as the different ways of how the two models could be photographed. The photographers then took it in turns to use the remote lighting control fittings to shoot one of the model's indoors and the other out on the balcony, in natural light but with the benefit of fill-in flash.


The Pink Group also progressed, via the equipment hiring table, to the Creative Still Life setups in the other section of the room where Thea had provided a few wine bottles for positioning in one light tent while another couple of wine bottles, with a triangle of stilton cheese and the choice of green or red grapes, had been placed on a board on coloured card, with a variety of coloured card options available to place behind the set. Again, the Canon Speedlights had been arranged to reflect the optimum amount of correctly-angled light on the scene.

This format was repeated after a delicious sandwich lunch, with the groups reversed. The day ended with Frankie running a short session in the auditorium, on how to set up the autofocus function on a Canon 5D Mark 4, while attendees completed Canon's feedback forms.

Thanks to the generosity of Canon, participants were offered the opportunity to take home an A2 or A3 print, produced straight out of camera, due to a large format printer having been made available within each workshop space, ably manned by Jay and Mark.

The day was a great success, thanks to Canon's tireless efforts to make it as enjoyable, informative and useful as possible and we hope that this event will lead to many more such wonderful opportunities being offered to members of photographic clubs affiliated to the PAGB.


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
