## Bharat Patel DPAGB ARPS

I am a traveller and photographer based in Oxford. My interest in photography goes all the way back to my teenage years when I had many opportunities to travel, helped by my curiosity to learn about other people and places.

For the last 15 years I have concentrated in visits to my ancestral home of India for various projects. My main purpose is to document the lives of various communities in India and try to bring awareness of how others live, so speaking the local language helps me immensely. My projects seem to lead from one into another. Quite often they are related. For example, while doing the project on women workers, I came across salt workers, then brick kiln workers and bonded labour and then into nomadic tribes and forest dwelling tribes.

When I can, I work with NGOs or other institutions/ through which I learn about the subject. I use both colour and black and

white images. I may even use a mix of these in the same project as I find that the combination often helps to better express the ideas.

My latest projects, almost complete, is on the Nomadic Tribes of India. It is several years working with these tribes who for centuries have travelled from place to place, offering their services and products. Once welcomed at every village, they have slowly come to be one of the most marginalised communities. Their story is similar to that of the Roma/Gypsies.



My book will form an archive of the history and the lives of the nomadic tribes and will


show the present conditions of these stateless communities. The hard cover book will be 30cm X 25 cm

with almost 200 pages containing more than 150 colour and sepia tones images.



#### Michael O'Sullivan FRPS FIPF

Michael O'Sullivan is a creative professional photographer based in County Cork, Ireland, working in both Commercial and Fine Art arenas. He is a former president of the Irish Photographic Federation and is a very experienced photographer in both the amateur and professional arenas, having had his work published both nationally and internationally. He produces Landscape, fashion, commercial and portrait work, but is best known for his personal work, which may be described as "Conceptual Fantasy Art". Stylistically, his work references the painters of the Renaissance, Baroque and Romantic eras, as well as the great fantasy artists of the 20th century, but retains a unique signature.. Michael is a member of the Adjudication panel for photographic distinctions with the Irish Photographic Federation and also serves on the RPS Applied and Portraiture Associate and Fellowship Panel.

#### Chris Palmer FRPS EFIAP DPAGB APAGB

Introduced to photography, and the darkroom, by his father when he was about seven years old, Chris has been producing pictures ever since. He became actively involved in club photography in 1979 as a member of Field End Photographic Society in Ruislip, Middlesex. He now serves as Chair of the RPS Visual Art Associate and Fellowship panel and as an assessor on the Landscape panel. A busy national PAGB judge, and popular lecturer, he has visited more than 280 different camera clubs, and judged many regional, national and international exhibitions. Chris is a member of the prestigious London Salon of Photography. Chris is a member of Amersham Photographic Society. In his own words "For me photography is far more than just an exercise taking pictures. Deep within me is a creative urge and probably a frustrated artist too. I realised long ago that I do not have ability with a pencil or a brush so I turn to my camera to express my vision".

#### Jennifer Willis MPAGB FRPS FIPF EFIAP

Jennifer's photography comes from within. She is a perfectionist with a competitive spirit and constantly seeks to improve. However, more than anything she needs to use her abilities to help others. She tells things like they are and, since October 2021, has worked on a hugely important project to raise awareness of women living with Secondary (Metastatic/Stage 4/Advanced) Breast Cancer in Northern Ireland. Her first stunning exhibition of 32 powerful portraits of 16 women was hosted by Belfast Exposed Photography Gallery, Belfast and has since toured to several other galleries, attracting great attendances and exciting reviews. A hugely successful exhibition in terms of not only raising awareness but which also brought a huge footfall into the gallery many who had never set foot in an art gallery before. Involved many photographic, emotional and political challenges. She has been invited to produce similar work in Scottland. Her pictures have made a difference and will continue to do so.





## HAVE YOU STOPPED MAKING PRINTS? ITS TIME TO PRINT AGAIN!

The last few years have seen a reduction in Print Competitions, many were abandoned during our lockdown and some have never resumed. Many Clubs managed to continue with their regular in-house Print Competitions, some even managed Inter-Club events, but many more have simply dropped Prints entirely.

Maybe you have awoken your trusty printer from its hibernation and discovered that it is a bit long in the tooth, or worse, it is refusing to come back to life! Can you afford a new printer? You may still have a stock of paper but a new printer will need new ink! A new printer is a significant investment,

although probably costing less than your camera, maybe even your best lens. Running costs are also significant - around £2.00 for a sheet of good photo paper and something like £1.50 for the ink.

Of course, you have to worry about the rising cost of your daily living. Don't discount the joy of holding a beautifully printed image in your hand or displaying it on a wall to an appreciative audience, rather than its existing only in a transient glimpse on a smart phone. Here in an instant and gone just as quickly.

## Programme for the 2024 Submission of Applications for FIAP Distinctions

Applicants for AFIAP, EFIAP and EFIAP Levels who have achieved the criteria (\*\*see note below) should, by email, contact Howard Tate to register, at fiap@btinternet.com, at any time from Monday 13<sup>th</sup> November 2023 until Wednesday 31<sup>st</sup> January 2024

PLEASE DO NOT seek to register unless you have achieved the criteria and the relevant salon Files have been submitted to FIAP (\*\*see note below). The process is not designed to deal with speculative requests made in the hope or expectation of reaching targets before the deadline date.

\*\* Note:- Achieving the criteria means that, not only have you achieved the required results, BUT ALSO that FIAP have received the relevant "Salon Report Files" from the salons. This can be checked on the "myfiap" Platform at:- <u>https://www.myfiap.net/patronages</u>

To register, please email Howard with your details, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER YOU HAVE APPLIED BEFORE, and include,

- a) Your full name & address including post code, and telephone number(s).
- b) The distinction you intend applying for.
- c) Confirmation that you have achieved the criteria as described above.
- d) Details of the number of your FIAP Life Card AND of your "FP Number"

(ie TWO separate numbers). Once this is received, and subject to the next paragraph, you will be forwarded an "Applications Package".

No registrations will be accepted after **31**<sup>st</sup> **January 2024**, so please do not ask. No acceptances from salons with a 2024 FIAP Salon Number will be accepted, regardless of when those results are received. If you have not achieved your target by the above date, you must wait until the 2025 submission to apply.

Once you have received the "Applications Package", fully complete the whole (ie: all 3 required sheets) of the FIAP Dossier file as early as practicable and submit a copy of it to me by email for checking, but not until **Friday 1 December 2023.** 

Once your Dossier file has been approved and sent back to you, you can complete your application fully and post it to me. However, to enable my family to enjoy Christmas without piles of applications around, pleasedo not forward them until on or after **Friday 5 January 2024**.

The closing date for fully completed applications to reach me is **Sunday 31 March 2024.** This timetable ensures that, for anyone who is following on from an award gained in 2023, there will be the necessary 12 months gap between the previous distinction award level and application for the next award level.

#### **MFIAP** Applications

You should aim to have your application completed and with me no later than **Friday 15 December 2023**. Because of the FIAP Distinctions workload, any submissions after this date cannot be guaranteed to reach FIAP in time for the 2024 batch of submissions to be processed.
