"HEAVENS ABOVE" BY RICHARD HAINSWORTH AWPF

Landscape Astrophotography, the hardest, most frustrating, most satisfying thing I have attempted in photography.

Inspired and encouraged by members of Mold Camera Club, I first considered applying for the AWPF distinction a few years ago. Initially I put the WPF and PAGB committees through some debates about whether video game photography was a valid subject for a distinction, but my issue with panels is that I am prone to picking up and dropping new passions before completing a whole panel.



Then, in summer 2020, I attempted to photograph the comet Neowise over a lighthouse on Anglesey. Fuzzy, noisy shots ending in an upended tripod and a smashed lens. I was hooked. My new addiction was astrophotography, which turned out to be the hardest, most frustrating, most satisfying photographic thing I have ever attempted..

After much reading and watching of YouTube videos - shout out to Alyn Wallace. Astrobackyard and NebulaPhotos - I began to make progress and initially had an idea for a panel which would take in both landscapes and the nebulae and the galaxies in night sky above. However a very helpful workshop run by the WPF resulted in my revising the plan to focus on the landscapes only, both to provide coherence and because there is more that you can do to make these images creative and personal compared to the straight deep sky images, much as I love them. By September 2023 I had a panel of 12 images that I was proud of and thought worked together.

On the way I had many awe-inspiring evenings in remote locations under the night skies, mostly in North Wales, and many frustrating nights sat under clouds in the cold. The majority of the resulting images are faithful to the location, with the sky being taken as a stacked sequence of long exposures, sometimes tracked, in the same locations as the foregrounds, mostly in the blue hour after sunset. However a few have skies from other occasions and locations, though in the correct orientation, when the weather was not co-operating, and some are creative fictions - goats don't stand still long enough to get shots of them with the Milky Way, but the Capricorn conceit was appealing.

On the assessment day, nerves were jangling. The assessors were clearly taking their role seriously. A number of great panels before mine passed, but several did not. However, when it came to mine, the assessors had nice things to say about the technique and presentation, and it was particularly gratifying to hear them talk about the sense of emotion in the images. I do find it a moving and spiritual experience to sit watching the stars, alone in some beautiful, rugged scenery, enjoying that hour or so contemplating the vastness that we are part of. I was glad some of this communicated through the images and was honoured to receive the distinction Associate of the Welsh Photographic Federation.

Thanks to all involved for the smooth organisation, and to others being assessed that day for their encouragement and kind comments. The whole experience was very satisfying, particularly for someone who focuses normally on individual images that stand alone. A panel was a challenge worth tackling.

Next stop is the Sahara Desert in December for some truly dark skies and, please, no clouds.

The PAGB makes an entry on behalf of 'Great Britain and Northern Ireland'.

This year we would like to invite you to take part in this selection process for the FIAP Nature Biennial by submitting up to 12 nature images across the following three categories;

- a. Mammals
- b. Birds
- c. Other

Your entries would need to strictly comply with the FIAP nature definition and not have been used in a previous biennial competition entry.

The FIAP Competition has both Print and Digital Sections, so following a successful selection, you may be asked to provide a high resolution version (if selected for the Print entry).

Both our digital and print entries will need to be on a theme, and this will be taken into account during the select process.

30 Images will be selected in total and all images scoring more than 8 points in the actual FIAP Biennial can be used a part of a FIAP Distinction Application. Online Entry Opens: 18th December 2023 Closes: 31st March 2024 Selected: 1st April 2024

Gianpiero tells us – "The shot is from my home garden in Leicestershire, UK. After a snowfall during the night, several Fieldfare came in the garden to take advantage of the apple that I provided. This one was very aggressive and took over the entire garden chasing away all the other birds. I started to take some pictures from the house through a window, but I was not happy

with the composition. I thought a ground level composition would have been much better. So first I had to build a pile of snow to use as a background and then lay on the ground under a camouflage blanket, waiting for the bird to return to eat the apples".
