




I am hoping that this will be a longer term project aimed at broadening the range of photographs which are rewarded in Camera Clubs and in Regional and National Exhibitions. Perhaps one day, we may be able to gather together influential judges and Judge's Secretaries from Federations to consider some of this work. There will certainly be an extensive e-news special issue and maybe even a Recorded Lecture.



To date, I have received "Dare to be Different" images from 23 people and a small selection is shown here. Not every image fits the brief of being work which is of value but dosen't do well in Camera Clubs. Quite a few seem to me to be perfectly acceptable as Club

photography and have, in fact, achieved success. Others look like normal Club work but just not done very well. Many are exciting images which you could appreciate on the walls of an art gallery but probably don't appeal to many photographic judges.

I should mention here that a thousand judges will probably have 1000 different opinions and there are many who are open to documentary, abstract, record, reportage and street photography – just a few of the genre which often fare badly in competitions. I received my first camera aged ten. I graduated with a degree in Graphic Fine Art with my final project primarily being a photo-documentary. I went on to be a busy mother and didn't pick up a camera properly



again until 26 years later, when I enrolled on an Adult Ed digital photography course in the autumn of 2018 and I joined my local camera club, City of Canterbury Photographic Society in 2019.

I found myself drawn to photo documentary/journalism and spent the year of 2019 visiting a

local fruit farm. I exhibited this work in 2021 and published a coffee table book. It was exhibited at the National Fruit Show and a copy of the book was given to the Minister of Agriculture. In 2020 I published a photo book of my city during the lockdown which was sold through my local Waterstones.

The 6th MOP came to a local town in 2023 and I was surprised and excited to see such a variety of original and interesting photographs. It challenged my belief that the PAGB was rather narrow in its preferred genres. I decided then to subscribe to e-news and entered the Masters of Print the following year.


Aside from enjoying the boldness the camera gives me to approach people, I also love to hike in the Winter Stillness, countryside. accepted into the Masters of Print, was taken early on a foggy, frosty morning when the wood was quiet and I was alone. 


FIAP Entry Selections for the 2024 Nature Biennial

















Images from the Winning 2022 Print Entry



Every year the FIAP hold a number of Prestigious Biennial Competitions for its member countries.

The PAGB makes an entry on behalf of 'Great Britain and Northern Ireland'.

This year we would like to invite you to take part in this selection process for the FIAP Nature Biennial by submitting up to 12 nature images across the following three categories;

- a. Mammals
- b. Birds

c. Other

Your entries would need to strictly comply with the FIAP nature definition and not have been used in a previous biennial competition entry.

The FIAP Competition has both Print and Digital Sections, so following a successful selection, you may be asked to provide a high resolution version (if selected for the Print entry).

Both our digital and print entries will need to be on a theme, and this will be taken into account during the select process.

30 Images will be selected in total and all images scoring more than 8 points in the actual FIAP Biennial can be used a part of a FIAP Distinction Application.

Opens: 18th December 2023 Closes: 31st March 2024 Selected: 1st April 2024 https://pagbhost.co.uk

Images should be saved in jpg srgb format and up to 3600 pixels on their longest side before uploading to the Competition Entry System. https://pagbhost.co.uk

All submitted images will be scored and the higher scoring images along with the selected images will be included on a Digital Slideshow available from the PAGB Recorded Lecture Service.

A unique limited edition PAGB Enamel Badge will be given to all authors selected to represent 'Great Britain and Northern



Ireland' in the FIAP Biennial Competition.

Please Note. Authors from clubs in the Scottish and South Wales Federations are not eligible, as their Federation makes a separate entry.
