The Masters of Print Exhibition is restricted to just 60 prints from 60 different photographers and this makes an Acceptance particularly difficult. Many excellent photographers and many excellent prints were unlucky and this Salon Des Refusés, which is now available as unmounted A3 prints through the PAGB Recorded Lecture Service is of the same quality. Acceptance to this second exhibition doesn't come with our unique badge or election to the Masters Hall of Fame but it has exciting prints and is still an achievement to be proud of. It will make a great evening for your Club.

THE SIXTH MASTERS OF PRINT EXHIBITION

The Sixth Masters of Print exhibition will be removed from the frames in February to permit the hanging of the Seventh exhibition but it will not be destroyed. The mounted prints are being made available, primarily through Federations.

It isn't suitable for long term hanging but is ideal for display at Club and Federation events. It comes in several very large boxes and is probably better handled by a Federation, who can display it at an event and/or arrange circulation to several Clubs.
