


with our unique badge or election to the Masters Hall of Fame but it has exciting prints. It will make a great evening for your Club.



# **Guidance – Photographer Eligibility**

The eligibility of a Photographer applies to a particular Club as part of an entry by the Club, or as part of an entry which references that Club.

A Photographer who is, or has been, a member of more than one Club may be eligible via one Club but not via another. It is a universal requirement that a Photographer's Images may only be submitted to one Event by one Entrant. The Photographer and Clubs must have clear arrangements in place to ensure this happens.

Clubs have the relevant information about their members and have primary responsibility for determining Photographer eligibility. Clubs should be prepared to explain the basis of a Photographer's eligibility on enquiry from the PAGB, the Federation or the Photographer.

Clubs will have a local catchment area covering distances which would allow members to attend physical meetings. Members from another Federation recruited from outside that area can only be considered eligible to enter PAGB competitions via the Club after specific PAGB approval, which will only be granted in exceptional circumstances.

If a Club is entering a PAGB Competition and there is doubt about eligibility, the Club should apply for a ruling from the PAGB. Prepare an application to include the following, with your justification for seeking an exception:

- Name of the Club and Federation.
- Name and postcode of the person concerned.
- Duration of membership of the Club.
- How often the Club has physically met in the last 12 months and how many times this person has physically attended. Do not include online meetings or outings.
- Any specific reasons why this member cannot attend regularly or cannot attend a more local Club.
- Any known membership of other Clubs.
- Why the eligibility is being claimed.

Send the application to eligibility@thepagb.org.uk

The application will be considered and the Club should retain the reply for reference.

A revised application should be made if the original information changes significantly.

Consult with your Club if you are in any doubt about your eligibility based on the Event conditions and this guidance. Explain to your Club if you need to opt out from allowing entry of your Images to any PAGB events.

The following is an overview based on guidance supplied to Scottish Clubs by the Scottish Photographic Federation.



#### Do you need a PAGB CES account?

You need a CES account if you wish to access PAGB on-line services which are reserved for Clubs and their members who are affiliated to the PAGB through their Federation. If you previously used the PAGB Handbook or you want to enter a PAGB Competition, you need a PAGB CES account.

An account must be approved at one or more levels of Club member, Club officer or Federation officer to gain access to services reserved for each of those levels. Separately, an account can offer activities for inclusion in the Speakers' Register (containing Judges and Lecturers).

#### What Is Available in the PAGB CES?

The Find A Club map and the Recorded Lecture catalogue are open access. To access other services you need to register for a personal CES account as explained in the webpage above under the How Do I? section. Further help is available under the Frequently Asked Questions.

The account is 'personal' to you and not your Club. You may only have one login account but this can be used for multiple purposes, and even for more than one Club.

You must use a personal email address to create your login to the CES.

I.E., not secretary@clubemail style addresses.

#### **What You Can Access**

**dependent on the level of account you have** after you have created a CES Login or have Registered as above.

#### With your Initial Personal account'

- You can edit your personal details.
- Make yourself known in the Directory.
- Edit any of your own personal Judges or Speaker activity records
- See digital catalogues and virtual exhibitions
- Buy event tickets.
- Search the image archives.
- View available speaker activities from the PAGB (without access to contact information)

#### With your Club member approval, add the following access;

Club Member status must be confirmed before you will have access, unless you are already listed in the CES as an author for that Club in a previous PAGB event or competition or PAGB Awards Adjudication,

- You can iew your images entered into PAGB competitions and their results.
- Enter PAGB Masters of Print (as an Individual)
- Enter Awards for Photographic Merit (Only for applicants, who will receive detailed instructions)

#### With your Club (or Federation) officer approval, add the following:

This higher level of access requires approval to be given by your Club, or Federation.

- View images and results from PAGB competitions Club entry (or Federation entry) respectively
- Enter PAGB competitions Club entry (or Federation entry) respectively.
- View speakers (Judges & Lecturers) and their activities and contact them.
- Buy a license and download a Recorded Lecture.
- Submit a form, such as a Patronage Application.
- View the Directory.

#### The Speakers Register (+)

The Register replaces the lists of judges and lecturers in the PAGB Handbook. Federations may also maintain local lists. Only those approved in the CES as Club officers or Federation officers can use the Register. See section 6.3.1 in Officer Services.

# CES: Entries/Admin System This has been published bef but you may have missed it.

The PAGB Entries/Admin system is commonly referred to as the Central Entries System:

A crisis creates opportunity and change: a realisation that, if cannot be done the same way, then other ways must be found. In recent times, on-line conference software such as Zoom have opened the opportunity for Clubs to invite speakers from distances which were previously impossible. Likewise, on-line delivery of information and services has become much more important. The PAGB is supporting Federations and Clubs in these changes using its Central Entries System (CES).

From small beginnings as an entry system for the Inter-Federation competition, the CES has grown to support entries for all PAGB events.

From small beginnings as an entry system for the Inter-Federation competition, the CES has grown to support entries for all PAGB events, including our Awards for Photographic Merit, and also supports service delivery direct to Federations, Clubs and their members. To do this required a change of philosophy from a system with accounts for roles such as 'competition secretary', to one with accounts for individuals in their own right.

The CES holds information such as contact details and Club and Federation memberships. Since anyone in the world can create an account, account holders must be specifically authorised to access only the information they require for whatever status they have as a Club member, a Club officer or a Federation officer. We call these 'approvals', which must be requested, independently verified, and then managed over

The PAGB has produced a printed Handbook, once every two years, which has been delivered as one copy per Club. The Handbook contains a mix of content, such as contact details and procedures, but the majority of the content is the lists of approved judges and lecturers. This made the Handbook vital to programme secretaries. However, one copy can only be used by one person. Who decides who that will be? Does anyone relevant on the Club committee know who has the copy, or even know that such a copy exists? What if it is lost? These are issues inherent in any paper-based system, quite apart from the time and effort of collation and the costs of production and distribution.

It is Federations who put the effort and resource into recruitment and training of speakers for Clubs, and who approve speakers for their own lists and for the lists in the PAGB Handbook. Following a detailed design and consultation, Federations agreed that the PAGB should create an on-line speakers register which retains Federation control over speaker approvals. It is a fine example of the PAGB role to support Federations in commonly defined aims. Judge records have been entered to the new register and the addition of lecture records is ongoing. So far the CES has over 600 judges and about 1000 lectures. More will follow.

With this on-line speakers register it is now possible for an approved CES account holder to access details of speakers without searching for the handbook, or wondering whether the information is still accurate.

So, what does 'approved' mean in this context? Just as the Handbook was available for use by any member of a Club committee or a Federation committee, the accounts in CES which can access the speakers' contact information are those approved as a Club or Federation officer (committee member). Now that the CES has evolved into a service delivery system, there is a real need for Club committee members to have a CES account with Club officer approval so that they can access services for their Club. There are still many PAGB affiliated Clubs which have no officers recorded in the CES who have effectively excluded themselves excluded from PAGB provided services until they have at least one account approved as an officer.


