### SINWP Bird Photographer of the Year 2024 in aid of RSPB




#### Parakeet Biting Monitor lizard by Hira Punjabi from Maharashtra, India.

Hira takes us through his amazing shot – "This is a bird sanctuary where many migratory birds comes here in winter and some residents birds breeds here, January is very cold month and many times there is a mist and fog, I has observed this behaviour if birds attacking snake and lizards, as they feed on bird eggs, last 30 years I am going here, but this time I was lucky, for continues observing 4 days the same dry tree, one morning a pair of Parakeets along with some 10 or 12 birds started attacking the lizards, the whole drama lasted for an hour or so, I had managed to shoot many images, but this one is my favourite."

### Jane Hall Black ARPS FPSA HonPAGB, Hon Life Vice President of the NCPF

Jane Black joined Tynemouth PS in 1959 and was an active member of that society until her health began to fail her. She was its General Secretary from 1962 until 1969



and in recognition of her work for the society she was made a Life Member of the club in 2003. She was also a member of Sunderland PA, UPP Circle 36, PSA and a Life Member of the RPS.

She was a member of the Northern Counties (NCPF) Executive continuously from her election to that body in 1965. From 1967 until 1971 she held the post of Competition Secretary for the NCPF, relinquishing it to become Vice President of the NCPF in November 1971, between then and 1980 she served in that post, then as President followed by a two years as Immediate Past President. In 2017 she was only the second person to be appointed Honorary Life Vice President of the NCPF.

She was an active Lecturer on the Federation List from about 1965 and on their Judges List since 1970, both to about 2020.

Round about 1988 she took over as Regional Organiser for the North East Region (now the Northern Region) of the RPS, a post that she held until 2016. During that time she organised monthly events for RPS members in the region., including two weekend photographic conventions each year. These events continued to be popular drawing support from all over the country. In addition it was her innovation in 2002 to start organising overseas photographic holidays for RPS members in the Northern Region. These became an established part of the RPS Northern Region programme for a number of years.

In November of 2003 at its AGM she was elected to the Council of the RPS a post she held for a number of years. The RPS recognised her work, awarding her the prestigious Fenton Medal.

Jane was elected to the PAGB Executive as the NCPF Member in 1978 and held that post continuously until she stood down in 2000 following her appointment as Vice-President of the PAGB. Between 2001 and 2003 she was PAGB President and Immediate Past President from 2003 to 2005, returning to the PAGB Executive shortly after as the Representative of the RPS. During her period with the PAGB she held the post of Competitions Administration Officer continuously from 1993 until 2001 and also served on many Sub-committees including the Awards for Photographic Merit (a member of this sub-committee when the rules were devised), the Colour Slide Championships, the Finance Sub-Committee, the Judges Selection Sub-Committee and as the PAGB Delegate to the RPS Council.


She was appointed to the PAGB List of Approved Judges in 1995 and, in 2004, the PAGB awarded her their highest award for service, the J S Lancaster Medal with the honorific, HonPAGB.

In 1979, when the Stockton International Slide Exhibition ceased to function, she was instrumental in persuading the NCPF to take it on and out of this was born the Northern Counties International Slide Exhibition. She was appointed Chairman of the International Exhibition Sub-Committee in 1979 at its inception and held that post continuously for 40 years until failing health force her to relinquish the roll after the 2018 exhibition. I doubt that there is another instance of such a long period of unbroken service by anyone as chairman of an International Exhibition. She also introduced the use of international selectors to the Northern Counties, long before FIAP sort to encourage it.

In additional, when the South Shields International was unable to continue Jane willingly took on the responsibility of keeping its traditions alive by incorporating it into the Northern Counties Salon for several years, which she continued to run until the lack of volunteers to do the heavy lifting, required for a print salon, forced its demise.

A member of the PSA for many years she contributed to the PSA Journal on a number of occasions and was awarded a Bronze medal for those literary efforts, In addition in the PSA recognised her contribution to photography as a whole by awarding her the FPSA award, their highest award for service.

I suspect that long as the list of her efforts is, I shall have missed other contributions which Jane has made over the years. She had prodigious organising skills and deployed them in the interests of organised photography in an untiring manner for sixty years. The MASTERS ?F PRINT EXHIBITI?N is restricted to just 60 prints from 60 different photographers and this makes an Acceptance particularly difficult.
