


Championship. A great achievement in the face of stiff competition from the best UK Print Clubs.

I have been judging for 7 years, maybe 100 club competitions, and often I witnessed a struggle between the competition projectionist and his software to get the competition started! There is always stress and fear that the software won't work and that disaster and embarrassment will follow! Many keeping scores manually just in case! Fingers are kept always crossed!

As well as eliminating these issues, Pixoroo has been built to improve the whole experience for club members, judges, club competition and membership secretaries.

- 1. All club members can log in, do their work, log out and that is it.
- 2. A team of members can run club competitions. If a member is not around on night another member can take on. They can have different accessibility levels as well.
- 3. All members have full access not only to their entries but also to their club members' entries, Not only to the competitions that are run by the club but for external competition entries as well.
- 4. Using Pixoroo's easy interfaces you can run several types of competitions such as Aggregate, Exhibitions, Standalone, Challenge, Battles and External Competitions.
- 5. You can use "Hold Back" or "Points" scoring, or a combination of the two. Whatever you use, the results will be aggregated automatically and be available for all to see as soon as a competitions is judged.
- 6. Judges have their own portal on Pixoroo where they can pre-judge, score, and comment on the images. No more WeTransfer or moving images and documents via email. No need for the judges to bring torches on the night to read their scores either!
- 7. A club has its own "bank of judges" and if judges make their profile public, all clubs on Pixoroo can see their details and call them if wished.
- 8. Pixoroo makes competition between clubs a breeze. Create a competition and send links to all participating clubs. Any number of clubs can participate in a competition.
- 9. The Pixoroo Club Library, has ALL the images entered by the club members and finding and selecting images for media use or external competitions is as simple.
- 10. Pixoroo offers internal communication between the club and the members as well as the ability to do bulk email to all or any.

Pixoroo is new and this is only the second season running. At the moment there are 5 UK clubs running their competitions on Pixoroo, Cheltenham CC, Bromsgrove PS, Stroud CC, Kempsey CC and Cirencester CC. There are also two clubs in the continent and one the the USA that use Pixoroo.

M?P entrants are advised to inform their Club that their Prints have been entered for the M?P and are available for selection to the GB Trophy. (There is no fee to enter the GB Trophy competition.)

Important Note. Prints which have been selected for the MASTERS ?F PRINT EXHIBITI?N or for to form the SAL?N DES REFUSÉS cannot be forwarded and a new print will need to be provided to the Trophy Organiser.

How to enter the MASTERS **?**F PRINT (M?P)

This event allows you to enter as an Individual or you can organise a collection on behalf of your Club. You should be a bona fide member of a Club affiliated to the PAGB and you may only enter for one Club each year. We are looking for "new" exciting work, not previously exhibited, and all genre and styles have an equal chance of success.

Entries, either by an Individual or by a Club, must be made through the PAGB on-line Entries System. This includes PDI copies of your prints 2400 pixels on the longest side.

The system provides a download of labels, with barcodes, which must be fixed to the back of each Print. When viewed from the back, the label should be placed as close as possible to the top right corner. In addition to the Print labels, the system provides a download of documentation to be sent to the Organisers with the Prints.



3rd EPS International Digital Salon 2024





ONLY YOU CAN KNOW



I continue to receive communications, verbally and by e-mail, and I have followed many discussions on social media about how much effort a photographer should put into an image to make it their own. This article was first published in August2021

Many have claimed that they know of instances involving Remote Shooting, Nature Hides, Studio Workshops and Organised Photographic Events where the photographer has had no input at all, except to press the shutter. Many have never been involved in such activities but assume that there must have been lots of help, because they have not previously seen the same quality of work from that person.

The PAGB have no rules to define how much help you can have and, indeed, we accept entries which have been printed by someone else, even into the Masters of Print. We take the view that the entrant has ultimate responsibility for the image.

Amateur Photography, as practiced through Camera Clubs, is a social activity and Members are encouraged to learn from each other and to help each other improve their Art and their Craft. Most Club Members have benefitted from assistance in their Club and many, many Members have been willing to help. From advising on camera settings in the field or in the studio, helping with composition and exposure,

helping to process and print images to constructively criticising the final product and showing how it could be improved. Such activity is the very essence of most good Clubs!

Most organised events and photoshoot require the full participation of the photographer and, as a wellknown organiser once said to me, "I give you the ingredients, but you have to make the cake". If you weren't there, please don't be quick to judge.

It may well be true that some photographers have very little input to the images they have taken and may not do much to process them later. If you haven't made the INPUT, can you claim the OUTPUT?

Remember also that you must have photographed every element of your image and be very careful in the use of Artificial Intelligence tools which may import material from other sources.

ONLY YOU CAN KNOW. Do you believe in your heart that you have contributed enough to

feel that you own this image? If you don't feel that way, and you are successful in competitions with it, then what have you won? You may have won but where is personal satisfaction if most of the credit is due to someone else?

Be honest with yourself

Your name may be on the medal, but YOU know that it should be someone else being recognised. Be honest with yourself and you will gain much greater satisfaction from your photographic successes. Rod Wheelans. Editor
