I am privileged to be asked to judge national photographic competitions and I've had my own exhibitions. I regularly lecture on the photographic clubs/society circuit. An avid monochrome worker, I enjoy the simplicity that the black and white image affords. I believe that by removing colour, the focus is shifted, distractions are minimized viewers impressions are altered. My goal, wherever possible, is to create drama, mood and narrative power.



Although historically a darkroom worker I've embraced the digital age but, in doing so, I have tried to retain the merits of traditional photography. I enjoy the tactile physicality of a print and consider that the way an image is printed can influence the meaning and the emotional value that we attach to it.

"Printing is an intimate and exquisite craft which lies at the heart of photography".

As photographers, we should all print our images and take the liberty of encouraging others to do the same.

My interest in photography spans more than forty years and although it encompasses a number of genre's my affection for the simple distillation of images, particularly those with strong narrative power is one that



remains consistent irrespective of the photos I am taking. Often the subjects I photograph already have a strong story telling/documentary element, but by selectively composing, sensitively using lighting and carefully controlling tonal gradations, visual dialogue can be enhanced resulting in a more evocative and thought provoking final mage. Whether I am printing in colour or monochrome I enjoy natural lighting and have a

penchant for hard aggressive printing. I work in panels and produce congruent and thematic bodies of work.



Many of Colin's images explore the implied mystery of silhouettes.









Marilyn has put in an enormous amount of time and effort over the years to help the YPU and it's Clubs.







INFO 313 / 2025 E

The text provided below must be included in the salon rules of events organized under FIAP patronage which contain a "Nature" section.

The new definition which has been worked out together with officials of respective departments of PSA, takes effect immediately.

FIAP Nature definition

Content Guidelines

Nature photography records all branches of natural history except anthropology and archaeology. This includes all aspects of the physical world, both over water and underwater.

Nature images must convey the truth of the scene. A well-informed person should be able to identify the subject of the image and be satisfied that it has been presented honestly and that <u>no unethical practices</u> have been used to control the subject or capture the image. Images that directly or indirectly show any human activity threatening a living organism's life or welfare are not allowed.

The most important part of a Nature image is the nature story it tells. High technical standards are expected, and the image must look natural.

- Objects created by humans, and evidence of human activity, are allowed in Nature images only when they are a necessary part of the Nature story.
- Photographs of human-created hybrid plants, cultivated plants, feral animals, domesticated animals, human-created hybrid animals, and mounted or preserved zoological specimens are not allowed.
- Photographs made where the scene is natural and the animal is unharmed in a carefully managed environment, such as Zoo, rescue centers, and ethically managed natural environment farms are permitted.
- Attracting or controlling subjects through the use of food or sound for the purpose of photographing
 them is not allowed. Maintained situations such as provided supplemental food due to hardship caused
 by weather conditions or other conditions beyond the animals' control, where photography is incidental
 to the feeding of the animal does not fall under this provision.
- Controlling live subjects by chilling, anaesthetic, or any other method of restricting natural movement for a photograph is not allowed.
- Human-made elements shall be permitted under the following circumstances:
 - a) When they are an integral part of the nature story, such as a songbird singing atop a fence post a manmade object used as nest material, or a weather phenomenon destroying a man-made structure.
 - b) When they are a small but unavoidable part of the scene, such as an unobtrusive footprint or track in the background.
 - c) Scientific tags, collars, and bands are specifically allowed.

When photographing at a zoo, sanctuary, or rehabilitation centre, it would be construed that the photographer ensured that it's properly accredited and conforms to best practices.

Please do not confuse these Nature Criteria with the much simpler PAGB Criteria


