A moment of madness in applying for my CPAGB distinction, I wanted to use prints and since I'm the control freak from hell I wanted to produce them myself.

After much research, and much agonising I bought a medium quality printer, a book about printing and set off on the most exciting photographic journey I have ever been on. Its official I am now an evangelical print convert!

I can say that my photography has been improved immeasurably by learning to print, all the horrible little things that judges tend to notice, (and you wish you had), become so much more apparent with a print is in your hands, rather than looking on a screen.



An often overlooked advantage of printing is that the use of the right paper can elevate an image from nice to spectacular. An example of this is the lone tree image that I had accepted into the 2021 Masters of Print. On a normal lustre it was nice and I was pleased. However, on a fine art paper it was elevated to a portfolio shot, one that hangs in my living room.

However the main reason I print is that it's fun and I love doing it. If you are debating learning to print, take the plunge – you will become a convert as I have.

### MORE GOOD NEWS FOR NATURE PHOTOGRAPHERS!

Ed. Our FIAP correspondent has sent this to **e-news** although nothing yet appears on the FIAP website.

Following a recent extraordinary general meeting of the FIAP Council the rules on permitted nature history images are apparently being altered.

In future the scope of natural history and wildlife photography is to be widened to include museum exhibits and artificial models of plant, animal and insect species. This has been proposed and

ratified in order to encourage more people to enter Salons who might otherwise have been put off by the ever rising cost of international travel to photograph exotic birds and animals and also the cost of utilising "pay and display" hides. It was felt that this initiative would also go some way to encourage photographers to be more mindful of their carbon footprint. With climate change at the top of the agenda for organisations around the world, FIAP needs to play its part in promoting a greener, environmentally sustainable future.



Henceforth the use of images that depict scale models, including realistic toys, replicas or otherwise constructed nature artefacts will be permitted in Nature Sections of FIAP Approved Salons. It was initially proposed that such images would need to go into a separate section but after much consideration it was decided they should be allowed to complete alongside images taken in the conventional way.

### Top tips to make your photos stand out within the competition


- Avoid watermarks or any text on your images
- · Avoid over-editing your images
- · Ensure all images were taken by yourself
- Ensure your images are the correct size. For the purpose of uploading, the photos shall have a size of at least 1,920 x 1,080 pixels and a file size of no more than 22 megabytes (MB). JPEG is the only file format permitted
- The selection criteria include: the quality and creativity of the photo and how well the image matches to the contest theme
- Read the T's and C's for more guidance on the rules of the competition





This year we would like to invite you to take part in this selection process for the FIAP Colour Biennial by submitting up to 16 colour images across the following four categories;

- a. Still Life
- b. Architecture
- c. Sport and Action d. Creative Animals

The FIAP Biennial Competition is both a Print and PDI Competition, so we would be asking for high resolution versions of your images, if selected for the print entry.

30 Images will be selected in total and all images scoring more than 8 points in the actual FIAP Biennial can be used a part of a FIAP Distinction Application.

Out of the thirty Images we will select and Print 10 for our Print Entry and 20 for our Digital Entry.

A unique limited edition PAGB Enamel Badge will be given to all authors selected to represent 'England, North Wales and Northern Ireland' in the FIAP Biennial Competition.



Please Note. Authors from clubs in the Scottish and South Wales Federations are not eligible, as their Federation makes a separate entry.
