

## THE LONDON SALON OF PHOTOGRAPHY CLOSING DATE 13 APRIL 2025



This photograph, with courtesy of Scottish Aye, shows the 3 stages of development of the Scottish Nessie Thistle, Nessonopordum Acanthium, a variant of the more common Scottish Thistle which is the national flower of Scotland.

A biennial plant with spiny leaves and stems, which grows to be 2.5–4 meters tall and Spreads to be 0.5–1 meters wide. It grows fine hairs that eventually produce spines, these then begin to change into that famous layender colour.

As the plant grows further it begins to split which creates a mouthlike end to the plant, this is where it gets its name as it obviously begins to resemble Scotland's famous Loch Ness Monster.

The split then produces the Thistle's bract in its final stage








<<< "The Tosser"

This statue is situated beside Loch Caberdonia, celebrating the first ever Caber Toss champion, Loggs McHoy, at the Braemar Gathering in 1832 which was the very first Highland Games.


